

**3Q 2021 Cerebro Capital Non-Bank Lending Quarterly Survey**

Cerebro Capital fielded surveys in July 2021 and November 2021 to non-bank lenders that are part of Cerebro’s lender network. Cerebro questions focused only on Middle-Market C&I loans and were compared to Federal Reserve Senior Loan Officer Survey responses for large and mid-size businesses. Comparison questions from the Federal Reserve survey are included below each table where there was an equivalent question asked of commercial banks.
